2019 INITIATIVES & PROGRAMS

HUMANITARIAN & DISASTER RELIEF

Mercury One once again partnered with multiple humanitarian aid organizations in 2019 to bring services to veterans, and victims of human trafficking, family violence, poverty and those effected by natural disasters. With your generous support we gave over 1.1 million in humanitarian aid, providing services to over 15,000 individual families that were touched by a dramatic life changing event. It was your helping hand that gave them a reason to get up and rebuild a future for them and their children.

HURRICANE DORIAN AND CALIFORNIA WILDFIRES

Mercury One worked with partners including Operation Blessing, Operation BBQ Relief and Team Rubicon and many others who were onsite to deliver much needed food, water and various other much needed supplies to those affected by this season's storms. With your blessing Mercury One sent out more than \$425,000 in storm funding in 2019 and \$15,000 in helping those that were most devastated by the wildfires of the pacific northwest.

Team Rubicon was founded to utilize the skills and experiences of military veterans to provide immediate relief to those impacted by disasters and humanitarian crises. By engaging our nation's Veterans in continued service. Team Rubicon seeks to provide our veterans with three things they lose after leaving the military: a purpose, gained through disaster relief; community, built by serving with others; and identity, from recognizing the impact one individual can make. Coupled with leadership development and other opportunities, Team Rubicon looks to help veterans' transition from military to civilian life.







Operation Underground Railroad have gathered the world's experts in extraction operations and in anti-child trafficking efforts to bring an end to child slavery. O.U.R.'s Ops Team consists of former CIA, past and current law enforcement, and highly skilled operatives that lead coordinated identification and extraction efforts. These operations are always in conjunction with law enforcement throughout the world. Once victims are rescued, a comprehensive process involving justice for the perpetrators and recovery and rehabilitation for the survivors begins.



S.M. Wright Foundation's mission is to provide support and stability to underprivileged children and less fortunate families through hunger relief, economic empowerment, and assistance in the areas of education, health, and social services. It is unique among social services because it carries out its mission on a daily basis in our community providing hope, encouragement, and assistance to families in need. PERATION BLESSING

Operation Blessing is dedicated to demonstrating God's love by alleviating human suffering in the U.S. and around the world. For more than 40 years, Operation Blessing has provided hunger relief, medical care, clean water, and disaster relief to millions around the world.

EDUCATION

In 2019, Mercury One hosted a pop-up exhibit, titled 12 Score and 3 Years Ago: The Unfinished Promise of Unity, where we displayed over 100 artifacts, including documents, photographs, historical objects, and five captivating, augmented-reality experiences.





The exhibit shed light on the true history of slavery both in our nation and around the world, as well as the present state of slavery in the world today. The temporary exhibit was created in partnership with The African American Museum of Dallas, The Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library and Museum, Frontiers of Flight Museum, and Dallas Historical Society. 2113 tickets were sold for 12 Score, generating over \$91,000 in donations and enabling our ability to continue educating future generations.

In addition to temporary exhibits like 12 Score, we have continued to train young men and women through our Leadership Training Program, hosted in partnership with WallBuilders. Just this past summer, we had 56 young-adult

interns come through the program and experience a hands-on interaction with history through the seeing and holding of artifacts that have played a role in our nation's past. The participants in this program receive up-close instruction by Glenn Beck, David and Tim Barton, as well as a multitude of guest speakers. They are immersed in an encouraging, yet challenging environment and pushed to learn about the full journey of our nation's heritage - or as Glenn puts it - the good, the bad, and the ugly. Having read and held our founding documents, these students are able to go back to their respective walks of life, confident they can defend Truth.

Mercury One's Education initiatives are growing with a fierce velocity as our nation is more hungry than ever for Truth. We are so excited to continue their expansion through the generosity and commitment of our wonderful donors and partners.

2019 SUMMARY OF ACTIVITY

- We initiated Operation
 October Freedom in
 response to the crisis that
 began with the Turkish
 invasion of northern Syria;
- Christina, the 9-year-old
 Christian girl who was
 rescued from Daesh last
 year, traveled with her
 family to Australia to start a
 new life;
- We are working on the new requirements for Operation Baghuz Recovery for the Australian government so they can take the remaining Barghuz survivors;
- To date, we repatriated 60
 Christian families back to
 Batnaya with another 100
 families on the way we are
 also helping Christian
 families settle back in their
 homes in the Nineveh
 plains;
- Yazidi 8 and Yazidi 9
 programs are making
 progress with 3,000 more
 refugees to go;

- We continue to support cases like Rana as they await final emigration papers to Australia;
- Many of the Barghuz
 victims we recovered still
 require surgical treatment
 for gunshots or shrapnel
 wounds, and we are
 working hard to make sure
 they receive the necessary
 medical attention before
 emigration to Australia;
- Programs in Jordan and Lebanon continued doing extremely well, and we continue to work with local priests to feed and care for refugees;
- The ongoing crisis in Idlib created a humanitarian disaster that has pushed approximately 700,000 Syrians out of their homes, and our team is already rescuing Christians who fled the region.

In response to the Turkish invasion of northern Syria, we quickly mobilized our team to receive refugees fleeing the violence towards the border with Kurdistan. We provided desperately needed food supplies including potable water, sleeping bags, hygiene kits, medicine, and shelter. To date, we have received and assisted 230 refugees.






THE NUMBERS









Mercury One stands behind our 100% commitment. If a donor designates to the Disaster Relief Fund, Nazarene Fund, Education Fund, or other Humanitarian Fund campaigns, their donation goes to that designated campaign, and is not used towards administrative or fundraising expenses. Only donations that are received without restriction or raised via our annual Mercury One General and Administrative fundraiser are used to cover these types of expenses. We have many review processes in place to ensure our 100% commitment to honor donors' intent, and we have clean audits attest to that commitment.
